#### **Non-Uniform Days**

#### **Important Announcements and Reminders:**

\* <u>Fun Run is Coming!</u> This is PTA's biggest fundraiser of the year, and is also a fun event for students and staff members. The Fun Run will kick off with a student pep rally on September 11<sup>th</sup>. Students will gather pledges for every lap they complete and we'll celebrate at the Fun Run on September 20<sup>th</sup>. PTA will be sending home more information soon! ©

\* On-Line Emergency Cards: If you have not already done so, please log-on to the district's Parent Portal (http://family.ausd.us) to update your child's information. Even if there are no changes, you must check and verify all information EVERY year.

- \* Parking & Traffic: Please do NOT use the staff parking lot or neighbors' driveways to drop off and/or pick up your children. Please drive carefully and follow all traffic laws. This will help us keep our students safe and will help you avoid a citation.
- \* <u>Cafeteria Meals:</u> Students purchasing meals from the cafeteria should bring money each day or be able to show/recite/enter their ID number. You can monitor and add funds to your child's account through the district website: <u>www.ausd.us</u>. The full meal prices are \$1.50 for breakfast and \$3.00 for lunch. For students who qualify for reduced meals, breakfast is free and lunch is 40¢.

\* PTA Membership Drive: Please support our PTA by becoming a member by August 23<sup>rd</sup>. It only costs \$10 per person to join.

- \* SBAC Scores: Students' SBAC results are no longer sent home. You can access your child's scores (gr. 4-8) online through the Parent Portal, which you also need to access in order to update your emergency information each year.
- \* Class Leveling/Reorganization: During the next couple of weeks, it may be necessary to make some class changes to balance enrollment across the grade level and/or to stay under maximum class sizes. In some cases, students may be "overflowed" to another school. You will be notified if your child will be affected.
- \*\* No Drop-Off Policy: We would like to inform/remind parents about the "No Drop-Off" policy. When a student forgets something, it may be frustrating, but we believe in the long run, this policy develops responsibility and problem solving skills. It also limits interruptions to classroom instruction. Emergency situations will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.
- \* Volunteer Requirements: The district requires ALL volunteers to be fingerprinted and cleared through a Department of Justice background check. If you plan to volunteer, please come to the office to obtain the required form and details about the process. If you were cleared to volunteer last school year, you need to submit a new volunteer application form (available online or from the school office) for 2019-20, but you will not need to go through the fingerprinting/clearance process again.
